Mixed media art differs from other types of art, in that mixed media incorporates the use of various forms of visual art mediums. An example of this could be a painting done on canvas that incorporates several visual arts such as painting, drawing, and collage. Because this is an art form, it is open to freedom of expression, but there are some types of mixed media that are better known than others. We will discuss this in class. The possibilities of supplies used in the process are seemingly endless, if they remain within the visual arts realm. For example, if an artist were to create a collage, they may use paper, cardstock, canvas, magazine clippings, photos, and glue. For creating greeting cards, the supply list might include paint, cardstock, stickers, and stamps.

In a Mixed Media art class, the artist is encouraged to freely express their creativity and imagination in ways that differ greatly from traditional academic art. The basic supplies are included as part of this class. They include acrylic paint, brushes, watercolor paper and canvas. We will also offer pastels, charcoal and watercolor paints. You may choose to bring inks, glue, buttons, beads, photos, magazine clippings, or whatever interesting items you can think of. It helps to think of a specific idea or theme to make your piece come together. Dorothea will guide you in the creative process.
